How is NADPH Making a Difference?

- Data-driven research and development to accelerate the discovery of factors that impact maternal health disparities, understand how they interact, and how to best mitigate them.
- Community engagement to better understand the needs and factors that impact the health of expectant mothers from their personal perspectives.
- Advocating for increasing access to innovations in health science and technology, such as artificial intelligence (AI) and cutting-edge clinical research to bridge the gap in access to Precision Medicine-based healthcare in communities at greatest risk for maternal health disparities.
- STEM Training and workforce development that provides pathways to careers across the biomedical and healthcare enterprise to address social determinants of health experienced by expectant mothers and their families.

Precision Medicine for Maternal Health Disparities Expo

- NADPH is establishing an Annual Maternal Health Disparities Expo to present the best evidence-based resources available to help combat Maternal health disparities.
- This community-focused event will arm the mothers at greatest risk with validated resources and tools to identify, prevent, and reduce their risk for maternal health disparities, as well as make them aware of more targeted, precision medicine-based treatment options for various maternal health conditions.
